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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents



Over the years, I have been fortunate to be able to have the opportunity to visit Canberra with various schools and their Yr .7 and now Yr. 6 trips to Canberra. My first experience of this was in 2000.

At the time, I was the Acting Assistant Principal – Administration at St Francis Xavier School – Runaway Bay and I was accompanying our Year 7 students and their teachers on their annual Sydney-Canberra Trip. During our time in Canberra, among the many places we visited, the standout for me (as always is) was the Australian War Memorial.

We were lucky enough to arrive there during an extremely quiet period. We separated into our groups and spent some time (to the extent of, the group I was in charge of almost missing the bus back!) wandering around the displays and museums. Our group, consisting of around 8 year seven children and myself eventually found ourselves in the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and it felt as if we were standing there alone.

We spent about 15 minutes just thinking of the sacrifices made by these gallant young men and women when the thought of my Grandfather overwhelmed me. He had passed away back in 1991, but suddenly I was remembering sitting in the corner of Nan and Pop's lounge room as a child with Pop explaining the reasons why he received each of the medals in his impressive display.

I remembered how occasionally he would accidentally break into a story of his fighting days in Borneo and after a short space of time he would suddenly stop and refuse to continue. I'd be pleading with him to keep going – but to no avail. I also remembered the last time I saw my Pop (not knowing so at the time, although I'm pretty sure he did) and how we really talked. We talked about his life, about what I wanted to do when I grew up and how proud he was of me. I was 17 at the time. I remember how he told me that he wanted me to take care of his medals and how that made me feel pretty special. I remembered how proud I was to have a Pop like that – not only that he was my Pop, but more the true

digger he was. He had a real ANZAC spirit about him – he was a mate to many and I was privileged enough to be a mate of his!

I looked up and noticed my group was still standing there in the tomb of the Unknown Soldier (thank God!). I also felt a tear falling down my cheek. I quickly wiped it away, but honestly it was one of the most moving experiences of my life.

Still today, I can only imagine what my old mate was thinking when he used to tell me those half stories and parts of what he had experienced – lost mates, past battles, friends left with injuries and the like. I think about this regularly, but especially every ANZAC Day when I proudly march with his medals in his honour.

I only wish I had thought back then, when he was around, to thank him! Although I do think he has a fair idea of how thankful I am of him and what he and so many others like him did.

So yesterday was very special for my family and I, being the first of hopefully many ANZAC Day Marches with St Brigid's, Nerang at the Nerang RSL. I was filled with pride as there were just under 60 St Brigid's students, and several St Brigid's Staff Members who turned up to honour those who died. Thank you to each of those families who marched with us. Your presence was deeply appreciated.

As such, we wish to encourage all Year 3 and Year 5 students at St Brigid's to be involved in this assessment starting Tuesday 9 May.

Positive Behaviour for Learning at St Brigid's

Over the first two weeks of this term our whole school focus has returned to productive behaviours in the classroom.

In Week 1 our focus was ***Respect for Self and Others in the classroom*** using the success criteria "I show respect in my classroom by following the teacher's instructions".

Respect for Self and others in the Classroom also includes:

- Take turns
- Value others' opinions
- Make Christ present
- Use good manners
- Keep your space clean and tidy

Respect for Learning in the Classroom also includes:

- Active listening
- Put your hands up and wait
- Ask questions
- Have the tools you need
- Take pride in your work
- Do your best
- Contribute to learning

For Week 2 our focus is ***Respect for Learning in the classroom*** using the success criteria "I show respect for learning by being in the right place at the right time and ready to learn".

I encourage you to ask your children about what these mean to them.

With our new bell times this term it is a great time to revisit where children should be and at what time of the day.

St Brigid's School Day - Term 2

Students should arrive at school from 8:10am. When they get here they need to drop their bag at their classroom and head down to a supervised play area – both the hall and the Junior Adventure playground/Oval and supervised for play between 8:10 and 8:30am.

When the first bell goes at 8:30am the right place to head is:

Monday – to their class line in the MPA for Monday Morning Muster;

Tuesday to Friday – to their classroom to get organised for their learning day to start.

The second bell at 8:40am signals a start to formal lessons for the day. If students have PE or Music these start from 8:40am.

The first break bell goes at 10:40am and signals a move straight to play time. When the eating bell goes at 11:00am students head back to their classroom eating area, grab their lunch boxes and sit to eat. When the tuckshop is open (Wednesday to Friday) students are able to head down and buy during their eating time.

The middle session is signalled by a bell that rings at 11:20am. Students line back up with their class ready to head in for more learning.

The second break bell rings at 1:30pm and students again head straight out to play. On tuckshop days students should head straight to pick up any lunch orders at the start of playtime and they can also line up during their play time to buy food. The second break eating bell rings at 1:50pm and everyone heads back up to their class eating area.

The bell for the last session of the day rings at 2:00pm and runs till 3:00pm. At the end of the day students head to the right place for them:

Front reception – students catching the bus;

Outside the Church – car pool pick up for students with last names starting with A-M;

Outside the Admin building – car pool pick up for students with last names starting with N-Z;

Or to meet directly with parents in a negotiated spot or walk/ride home.

CLASS NEWS

Year 2 News

We hope that all the Year Two children, as well as their families had an 'eggcellent' and reflective Easter celebration! We are 'eggcited' by the new beginnings that a new term brings... Already there have been some adjustments and changes to our whole school routines and we appreciate your patience with this, but believe the changes are going to be well worth it!

Please be reminded that school officially begins at 8:40 am. We understand that occasionally, children can be late for important appointments or for unforeseen circumstances. However, we ask that each child arrives no later than 8:40 am. It is imperative that children arrive by 8:40, so they can: change their reader, perhaps organise library books, banking and/or tuckshop etc, listen to important messages and finally, settle before they begin the first lesson. Our goal is to start teaching absolutely no later than 9am. We appreciate your understanding and support regarding this matter.

In Term 2, subject rotations will continue, but now they will take place each Friday. Miss Burtenshaw will be teaching Science. In these lessons, children will explore the use of resources from Earth and will be introduced to the idea of the flow of matter when considering how water is used.

Mrs Essing will teach Geography. Students will explore how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders maintain their connection to places i.e.: Burleigh Headland (Jellurgal). They will also explore how distance and accessibility affects how often people travel to different places.

Mrs Purdon will be teaching Visual Arts. Throughout the term, students will examine different places/landmarks on the Gold Coast and produce artwork experimenting with various materials found in nature.

We hope that everyone was able to commemorate ANZAC Day in a special way. Children participated beautifully in Monday's Mass.

Library lessons re-commence this week (Thursday, Wk 2). If you have any questions regarding the new homework format (Studyladder) please see your child's teacher.

Thank you to all parents who were able to meet with their child's teacher recently. It was great to sit down and chat about your child's progress. There was a lot to celebrate! We look forward to seeing more progress throughout Term 2!

Year 3 News

Year 3 is gearing up for a big Term 2 as we spend the next few weeks preparing for our very first NAPLAN testing. Over the next few weeks we will expose children to NAPLAN materials such as the reading magazine, experience writing a specific text type using a writing stimulus, completing a spelling/grammar test in a written format(not oral e.g. teacher saying words) and how to independently complete a maths test.

Teachers guide children through the concept of 'fair test' conditions. These are explained to children as NAPLAN test instructions for teachers for ALL STUDENTS in AUSTRALIA so that all Year 3 students receive the same instructions e.g. teachers can read the maths test questions but cannot the numbers or mathematical signs. This is so every student is given the same test conditions under which he/she will complete the test. The children will experience the process of filling out test booklets correctly, reading questions carefully and simply 'having a go' to attempt questions within a very specific (usually 45 min.) time frame. We have a proud tradition at St. Brigid's of preparing students well so they feel confident, are familiar with NAPLAN material, understand the 'fair test' process and complete the booklets as best they can.

Year 4 News



Term Two has begun with a short but exciting first week back. The Year Four students were lucky enough to have a special ANZAC talk, given by Mr Mark Swain from the Nerang RSL, on Friday. He provided the students with an insight into what life was and is like for soldiers during wartime. The students had an opportunity to ask questions about not just the ANZACs but war in general. Mr Swain's historical knowledge about WWI, WWII and his experience from 1981 onward (whilst he

served in the army) was incredibly interesting for the enthusiastic children. We thank Mr Swain for his ongoing support towards our students each year.



Another exciting moment for our students on Friday included a fabulous opportunity to play with a traditional Japanese toy called a Kendama. Many students struggled at first with the rather challenging duce ball or cup-and-ball style game, but with great determination they eventually achieved success by the end of their Japanese class lesson.

Please note that there have been some changes to the Year 4 timetable. **Library** lessons will now be on **Mondays**, however students will continue to have the opportunity to borrow books on any day of the week (during second break). Please encourage your child(ren) to **borrow every week** and **read every day**. The more you read, the more you know. Furthermore, we will be stressing the importance of reading for meaning this term, which includes being able to answer both literal and implied questions about a variety of text types. This is a life long skill that we encourage you to discuss as you read with your child(ren) at home.

This coming week brings our always fun and competitive annual Cross Country Carnival on Wednesday and an exciting excursion to the PCYC Bicycle Safety Centre later in the week. Stay tuned to upcoming newsletters for photos of these events.

Year 5 News

Welcome to Term 2. It's a big term in Grade Five, with lots to keep us busy.

Thank you to those parents who have come to the Student-led conferences. This was a great opportunity to discuss your child's progress and areas they can improve on. Many parents commented that they appreciated the opportunity to have a conversation with their child about their learning. If you have not yet made contact to find a time to discuss your child's learning, please do so soon.

This term we are getting ready for NAPLAN. This will occur from the 9th to 11th of May. We will be doing some preparation in class to help the students know how to answer the types of questions that are on the test and strategies they might use. Parents can help by ensuring that students have a good nights sleep beforehand and a healthy breakfast to set them up for the day.

This term we have lots of exciting things to learn about. In Religion we will be learning about the Holy Spirit and the sacrament of Confirmation. We will be writing persuasive texts in English, as well as looking at different ways of telling a story, such as in visual form or a movie. In Science, we will be investigating the differences between solids, liquids and gases. In Geography we will be finding out more about bushfires.




